Current Research&Writing Projects

Currently writing a book on Turkish Politics, tentatively titled as “Politics in Modern Turkey: Ideologies and Identities”. Beginning with the Ottoman modernization in the middle of the 19th century and focusing on the time period following the World War II, the book will rely upon two empirical data sources: (1) the findings of the national opinion polls on Turkish political culture (Euroskepticism, conservatism, social class profiles and middle class values, othering and discrimination, Kurdish identity, political meaning frames and the left-right divide), that I have designed and conducted between 2002-2018; (2) the thematic field analyses of the hundreds of in-depth interviews with the elites and ordinary people, that have been carried out by students and research assistants as preliminary work for the opinion polls mentioned above.

1. **Turkish politics after the Second World War** (Problems of democratic transition and consolidation, with an emphasis on the external-internal linkages. Political ideologies and political culture in post-WWII Turkey with an emphasis on Euroskepticism, conservatism, and nationalism. Popular culture, with an emphasis on popular music.)
2. **European Integration and European Union-Turkey Relations** (Culture and Identity Dimensions of European Integration and European Union-Turkey Relations; Euroskepticism in Turkey and Turcoskepticism in Europe.)
3. **International Context of Democratization** (Emphasis on Turkey and southern Europe).
4. **Culture and Politics** (Theories and case studies of cultural hegemony and resistance; cultural hybridization and cultural globalization; theories of popular culture).
5. **Philosophy of Social Sciences** (Ontological, epistemological and methodological foundations of the social sciences; relations between macro and micro level phenomena; social and political psychology).

Artistic Creation

Hakan Yılmaz as a Lyrics Writer, Composer, Singer

Hakan Yılmaz's artistic career as a singer, lyrics writer and poet started in the early 1980s, when, with four other friends, he founded "Ezginin Günlüğü", which has later become a well-known folk-pop group of Turkey. He was part of the stage performances and studio recordings of Ezginin Günlüğü all through the 1980s. He was a leading singer in three of the group's albums that were released in the 80s: "Sabah Türküsü", "Alagözlü Yar" and "Doğu Türküleri". In 2008, he wrote the lyrics for two songs, "Raylar Boyunca" and "Aklım Hep Sende", composed by the late Tanju Duru, a friend from Ezginin Günlüğü, and released in Duru's album "Duru Zamanlar". In early 2012 he started to work on a new album with the guitarist and composer Kadir Şan Tarhan. The new album, "Sen Yoktun" (You Weren't There), including ten new songs, was released in 2015 by Ada Müzik in Istanbul. Yılmaz was the lyrics writer and lead singer of all the ten songs in that album. "Türkülerle Yeniden" (Back Again with Folk Songs), released in 2017 by Ada Müzik, is the second album of his cooperation with Kadir Şan Tarhan. Yılmaz contributed as a solo singer to the album, while Tarhan played the guitars and made the arrangements. Yılmaz is planning to record and release two new albums in the coming years, which will include his own compositions and lyrics.
